# **Ten Tips for Cycling**

- On the road, **ride to the left-**hand side of the carriageway, unless you are making a right turn, or road makings dictate otherwise.
- Ride in single file on roads and cycle paths in urban areas, to enable safe overtaking.
- **Keep a safe distance** from other road users, including cyclists, ahead of you. If you wish to overtake, look behind and pull out when it's safe.
- Communicate what you intend to do to other road users using **hand signals** and road positioning. Make **eye contact** with drivers whenever possible.
- Respect pedestrians, and their space. Do not cycle along paths and in areas reserved for pedestrians.
- Watch out for pot holes, debris, etc, which could destabilise you. Best to ride round such obstacles, but try and avoid sudden, jerky manoeuvres.
- Make sure **your bike is roadworthy and the right size** for you buy from a reputable source, or get a bike shop to check it over. Learn how to carry out basic maintenance.
- It's very hazardous to ride a bike **after dark** without working **front and rear lights**, and it's against the law.
- A heavy-duty lock is essential. Use it whenever you leave your machine, even for a short time.
- If you've regularly **got much to carry, let the bike do the work** with the help of a rack and panniers.
